



Review: 2 Peter 1:3-11 & History of the Allegorical/Literal Controversy; The Impact of Limited Atonement on American Theology

44. It is limited atonement's impact on the thinking of American Protestants that has caused so many to consider the performance of good works to be an essential part and parcel of the gospel of Jesus Christ.
45. This tragic fact means that in our client nation, where the church is constitutionally enabled to teach the gospel of Jesus Christ without restraint, this gospel is instead distorted and thus neutralized by this 400-year-old deviation from the truth.
46. There is no biblical justification for the doctrine of limited atonement. There are no verses that support the thesis. Thus the doctrine of limited atonement not only is not Calvin it is not biblical and therefore heretical.
47. The good works it demands are not motivated by reciprocal love for God but by a "keen interest" in proving what needs no proof beyond the clear testimony of the Word of God.
