## Two Worldviews: The West versus Marxism

- 1. The secret behind Marx's worldview was that he diverted peoples' attention by his focus on economics while by inversion of moral values he sewed deep-rooted moral and mental confusion in the West.
- 2. His first target was **Moral Order**:
  - (1) The general behavioral condition within a society which is derived by common adherence to cultural codes of conduct and standards of behavior written or unwritten.
  - (2) The norms of a society provide constraints upon individual behavior. These norms are obeyed voluntarily by common consent which prevents anarchy within society.
  - (3) These written or unwritten standards bond individuals in a society together and provide that society with integrity and cohesion.
- 3. Moral confusion arises from a multitude of conflicting groups, each with its own value system. This leads to a loss of clear distinctions between what is right and what is wrong.
- 4. Lucifer's second target was **Moral Disorder**:
  - (1) Confusion and uncertainty about what is moral good and what is moral evil emerges in the souls of the people.
  - (2) This condition arises from the lack of any commonly accepted basis for the determination of moral principles.
- 5. From this moral disorder, deviations away from established societal standards begin to emerge.
- 6. As new standards are ensconced into the people's worldview, Lucifer's rhetorical veils become evident and eventually reveal his hidden agenda.

- 7. Each compartmentalized group plays into Lucifer's hands by being polarized into warring factions who produce tension which leads to conflict which results in change.
- 8. Remember the definition of the Marxist version of "dialectical materialism": Tensions and conflicts are the driving forces for change.
- 9. A century of "change" has resulted in the United States facing a crisis of national values which is exacerbated by the moral disorder prevalent in its society.
- 10. This is the fulfillment of the Marxist strategy of alienation of thought within ta nation's mind-set.<sup>1</sup> Moral disorder is due to two factors: (1) An absence of moral values or (2) contradictory values which are exacerbated by the moral disorder prevalent in American society.
- 11. This leads to a sense of alienation and nihilism among the younger generation.
- 12. Nihilism: A belief that conditions are so bad as to make destruction desirable for its own sake independent of any constructive alternative.

A viewpoint that traditional values and beliefs are unfounded and that existence is senseless and useless.

Denial of any objective ground for moral truth.

- 13. If such thinking is allowed to spread throughout a society, it destroys that society's sense of cultural identity and integrity.
- 14. Marxist revolutionaries strive to undermine the societies they seek to topple by initiating and proliferating moral confusion.
