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9. Spirituality is referenced by other nomenclature in Scripture:

Galatians 5:16 - But I say, walk in the Spirit, and you will not carry out the desire of the flesh.

The verb walk is περιπατέω (peripatéō), to go on one's way. It is used figuratively for a rule by which one governs himself or a manner of life by which he is accustomed to employ.

Synonyms include: πορεύομαι (poreúomai): metaphorical for "to walk; to conduct oneself; rule or manner" (Acts 9:31, "living in the fear of the Lord") and τροχιά (trochiá): "a wheel-track; a way or path," figuratively, "ways of life or conduct" (Hebrews 12:13, cf. Proverbs 4:26: "make straight paths for your feet").

- 10. Therefore, the concept of spirituality refers to the believer being current on rebound which includes the filling of the Holy Spirit.
- 11. Therefore, spirituality and carnality are mutually exclusive.
- 12. Spirituality has nothing to do with the indwelling of the three Members of the Trinity. This is permanent and continues even when the believer is in status quo carnality.
- 13. Spirituality has nothing to do with the baptism of the Holy Spirit. This is a permanent condition of the believer being identified with Christ in His resurrection ascension, and session.
- 14. When out of fellowship, the believer may become involved in false concepts of spirituality, but which are only expressions of the sin nature's trends toward legalism (Colossians 2:16–21) and the production of human good (Hebrews 6:1; Titus 3:5).

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15. Spirituality is the status in which the believer produces divine good that is rewarded at the Evaluation Tribunal of Christ, illustrated in 1 Corinthians 3:12, 14 by gold, silver, and precious stones.

- 16. Spirituality is the status by which the filling of the Holy Spirit (1) takes an incoming principle of the Word of God, (2) establishes it as a new wheel-track of righteousness, (3) categorizes it in the soul with the doctrinal inventory that complements the new idea, (4) facilitates the believer's inventory of divine thought, and (5) retains the information in the neural traces of the brain.
- 17. In summary, the indwelling of the Holy Spirit takes place in the body of the believer beginning at the moment of salvation, and is permanent.
- 18. The filling of the Holy Spirit takes place in the soul whereby the believer, current on rebound, is in status quo spirituality functioning inside the divine power system or the bubble.
- 19. The indwelling of the Holy Spirit establishes the body as a temple for the indwelling of God the Father and Jesus Christ as Shekinah Glory.
- 20. The filling of the Holy Spirit is temporary being canceled by the commission of personal sin and loss of spiritual status. The believer remains in status quo carnality until he decides to confess his sins as per 1 John 1:9, cf. Psalm 32:5.
- 21. Biblical synonyms for spirituality include Galatians 5:16, "if you are <u>led</u> by means of the Spirit," Ephesians 5:18, "be <u>filled</u> with the Spirit," 1 John 1:7, "<u>walk</u> in the light," 2 Peter 1:4, "become <u>partakers</u> of the divine nature," and Hebrews 12:13, "make <u>straight paths</u> for our feet."
