## Egnatian Way at Thessalonica

The Romans were superb road builders. Major routes were graded and paved, making travel and commerce easier than ever before. The Egnatian Way, or Via Egnatia, extended from the Adriatic Sea on the western shore of Greece to the straits at Byzantium (later called Constantinople or Istanbul) to the east. The road was a major link between Italy and Asia. In Macedonia. the route passed through Thessalonica and Philippi among other cities.
